PUBLIC NOTICE

As a precautionary measure to help reduce the spread of the Coronavirus, by Executive Order of the Mayor of Winslow, Arizona, through Resolution Number 1836 and by Proclamation “Declaring of Local Emergency”, each passed the 17th Day of March, 2020, effective to March 21, 2020 and until April 3, 2020, the Mayor of the City of Winslow hereby issues the following Emergency Declaration:

All City of Winslow facilities, parks recreational events, meetings and non-essential services, contractual projects and consulting services, and all non-essential businesses, services, and other non-essential establishments within the jurisdictional boundary of the City of Winslow shall hereby close to the public at 5:00 PM today, Saturday March 21, 2020 and remain closed until 5:00 PM on April 3, 2020. The City will continue to monitor the situation and we will re-assess these restrictions on April 3, 2020.

The regularly City Council meeting scheduled for Tuesday, March 24, 2020 has been cancelled.

Essential City services will continue with the following restrictions:

- Winslow Police, 911, Fire and EMS will continue with full service, with these facilities providing restricted access to the public.

- City Transit service and “Shop for the Elderly” will remain in service, however the service will only be provided via telephone and internet. There will be no customer service provided on-site at the Winslow Transit Facility. Please call Winslow Transit directly at (928) 289-1462 for free transit service.
- Waste Management will continue to pick up trash and recycling on regularly scheduled days and routes.

Non-essential business and other establishments will be closed to the public, including:

- Churches and Fellowship Halls
- Retail, gift stores with no restaurants or food service
- Hair, nails and massage
- Auto sales and repairs, with an exemption for emergency circumstances
- Home Based Businesses that offer personal customer service based in the home.

Only essential public services and private businesses will be allowed to remain open for business, including:

- Banks and Financial Institutions, with restricted lobby service of 5 individual customers at a time, and may continue to offer ATM, drive up and web based services
- Hospitals
- Physician Offices and associated medical facilities
- Veterinarians
- Chiropractor and physical therapy services
- Restaurants, restricted to curbside and delivery service
- Grocery and convenience stores, and gas stations
- Department Stores
- Laundry Mats
- Food Banks
- Feed Stores
- Truck Stops

- Hotels, restricted to room stays only, no food provisions, pool access or other amenities
- Funeral and Mortuary Establishments

With these emergency provisions in mind, please take special precautions to practice social distancing, stay home where at all possible, consider teleworking policies, and immediately call your physician if you feel sick.

This declaration is made in the interest of our public health and safety, as we continue to navigate through this time of uncertainty. We wish to thank our community for your support and recognition of these mandatory restrictions during these uncertain times.
