EXECUTIVE ORDER AND EMERGENCY DECLARATION POLICY UPDATES AND CLARIFICATIONS

For further clarification regarding the Executive Order of the Mayor of Winslow, Arizona, through Resolution Number 1836 and by Proclamation “Declaring of Local Emergency”, each passed the 17th Day of March, 2020, effective March 21, 2020 and until April 3, 2020, the City announces the following directives:

- Retail shops and services with no restaurants or food service will be limited to online, curbside, drive-through, and delivery service only.
- Auto sales, parts and repair establishments will be limited to operations involving repair and service conducted on-site, emergency repairs, curbside and delivery service.
- Day Care Centers providing care for any individuals serving in an essential services category may continue to operate (per the AZ Governor’s Order 2020-12), and are encouraged to arrange for pick-up and drop-off of children outside of the facility, weather permitting.

- Hardware and Appliance Stores will be limited to online, curbside, delivery and emergency service.
- All parks are closed with the exception of McHood Park, which will remain open to the public until further notice. Playground and bathroom facilities will be closed until further notice.
- The City Transfer Station will be open to the public with limited hours. Refer to the City website at www.winslowaz.gov for details on days and times.
- Churches and Fellowship Halls are urged to offer worship services and meetings through live or recorded audio/video streaming.

The City reminds our community that we are in the midst of an emergency situation, and that special precautions must be taken immediately in an attempt to curtail the further spread of COVID-19. Our first priority remains keeping our citizens safe and healthy. The only way to do that is to limit personal contact.

We can all do our part by washing hands frequently for 20 seconds or more, practicing social distancing (6 feet or more) at all times, staying at home where at all possible, teleworking and teleconferencing as alternatives to traditional meetings, and immediately calling your physician if you feel sick. All residences and business establishments must also take extra measures at this time to maintain clean and sanitary conditions at all times within their homes and facilities.

Throughout the duration of these directives, please offer respect to our valued Peace Officers of the Winslow Police Department, who serve on our front-line, charged with the responsibility of enforcing these measures during this time of crisis. They are working hard to keep our City safe at all times.

These specific provisions within the City's Emergency Declaration are not issued as guidance, but rather are mandatory until April 3, 2020, at which time the City will re-evaluate the situation.

In the interest of our public health and safety, it is incumbent upon every member of our community to work together and adhere to these directives as we continue to navigate through this time of uncertainty.
